

During the spring of this year, I was honored by Bishop Malone to be appointed as the Administrator of Saint John Kanty and Saint Adalbert parish in Buffalo. This weekend we culminate the 125th Anniversary of the Founding of Saint John Kanty Parish. We also remember the 250th Anniversary of Saint John Kanty's canonization, and his status as our patron and the Patron Saint of Poland.

This great educator and champion of charity is a saint for our times. In his own words, "Beware disturbing: it's not sweetly pleasing, Beware speaking ill: for taking back words is burdensome." 100 years ago, this parish was the catalyst for converting the "wild East Side," into a new and peaceful American community through its educational and social programs, which were way ahead of their times. When I attended Bishop Neumann High School, we knew Saint John Kanty's as "the Sweetest Parish in the Diocese of Buffalo." May it ever remain so. May we all remain in the love of God, and of one another, and may today's celebration be the first of many in the years to come. You are most welcome, and may God bless you, and Mary love you.
