BAPTISM: Please call the parish office to make arrangements.

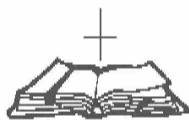

OUR 2018 MISSION COOPERATIVE APPEAL

The Propagation of the Faith office of our Lansing diocese has invited the diocese of KUMBakonam, India to speak to us about their missionary activities and challenges. Accordingly, **Rev. Mount Joseph Selvan Durai Raj** will be speaking to us during all the Masses on the weekend of **April 21/22**. This diocese has an area of 7823 sq km. and is situated in Tamil Nadu, South India with a Catholic population of 2,13,000 which is just 6 % of the total population. It is served by 200 diocesan and 73 religious priests, 568 nuns and 15 trained lay catechists. The Kumbakonam diocese celebrated the centenary of its inception in 1999 by setting certain concrete and meaningful goals for a New Evangelization in the III millennium, like:-

- 1) Establishing 12 more new parishes, each with a new church and rectory. At present, there are 93 parishes and 621 missions-stations. Many of these are so large that they have to be made independent parishes with a resident priest. But the people are quite unable to support the church, for such pressing pastoral projects. We have enough priests to staff more parishes.
- 2) Providing all the 126 Catholic schools in remote missions with better facilities tools, Children's Bibles, a projector, catechetical materials in the form of DVDs, pictures, books and workbooks to improve the quality of religious and faith formation of Catholic and non-Catholic students in our schools.
- 3) Now there are 505 nuns and 3155 Catholic Teachers in charge of catechetical, educational, medical and social ministries throughout this rural diocese, thus educating the children in the Catholic faith and helping the people, particularly the poor, for their integral development.
- 4) Since education is a main means of evangelizations here, the diocese has to provide buildings and infrastructure to our schools in remote villages while the government would pay most of our teachers.
- 5) Education of more young men in the seminary, since the rural diocese abounds in vocation to priesthood and religious life and sending a few as missionaries to missions abroad where there is a storage of priests.
- 6) Education of 2000 very poor or orphan children from remote villages every year by providing them with free board & lodge. All the above mission projects are 80% dependent on MCP funds each year. The diocese is trying to materialize these missionary goals, depending on the availability of funds. Every year, an average of 60 young men and women go out of this diocese to other missions throughout India and other parts of the world to serve God and His people as missionaries. The mission and spiritual prospects of Kumbakonam diocese are bright but its needs are many and pressing. 60% of its Catholics are depressingly poor.

Therefore, your fervent prayers and generous help are earnestly requested for building the Kingdom of God, in and through the diocese of Kumbakonam, India. SECOND COLLECTION WEEKEND OF APRIL 21/22.

BISHOP MALONE ANNOUNCES THE FORMATION OF A TASK FORCE-

Bishop Malone and his Presbyteral Council are currently looking into ways to promote both the spiritual welfare of priests and the liturgical life of each parish. They are particularly concerned about the number and quality of Masses celebrated at each parish. With a declining number of priests, we should not expect priests to celebrate more liturgies on a weekend than are needed; and, fewer Masses with larger attendance would encourage more vibrant celebrations of the Eucharist. The Bishop is asking all parishes to engage in a collaborate effort to look at Mass schedules and Mass attendance. This will be coordinated at the Vicariate level with suggestions to be sent to a Diocesan Task Force that has been established by the Bishop. Engagement in this process at the parish level will be vital in creating a revised and coordinated Vicariate Mass schedule that will promote the physical and spiritual well-being of priests as well as provide quality liturgical celebrations in each parish. .

FAITH FORMATION: Our 10 week Adult Faith Formation Program has started! Faith formation is a lifelong process. Join us if you can on Saturdays at 2 in the Parish Center...learn more about what Catholics believe, and why. There is a DVD presentation by the well-known Bishop Robert Barron of the Word on Fire Catholic Ministries followed by a short discussion. Refreshments are served, and the class ends in time to attend 4 o'clock Mass at SJK. The program runs through June 9. Although weekly attendance is encouraged it is not mandatory. Bring a family member or friend with you!

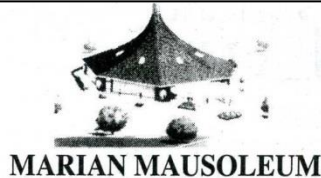
