They show us much about how to continually renew ourselves and our relationships with those around us and, most importantly, with God. The first reading portrays God as a loving parent who wants to take us by the hand and lead us down the path of a good life. It's a path that seeks justice, for us and for our neighbors. When we follow that path - when we help others to see God... or free someone from the confines of poverty or oppression – we renew for them faith in the good life which God wants for us all. Vigil for Life Mass. Every January hundreds of thousands of Americans from across the country journey to our nation's capital for the March for Life in observance of the Supreme Court decision legalizing abortion, Roe v. Wade. The night before the March there is a special vigil Mass for Life held at the Basilica of the Immaculate Conception where thousands gather to pray for the defense of life, from conception until natural death. For those unable to journey to our nation's capital, this year the Diocese of Buffalo will be hosting its own Vigil for Life Mass on Thursday, January 17 at 7 pm at St. John Paul II Parish, 2052 Lakeview Rd., Lake View. This Mass will coincide with the Mass being celebrated in Washington that evening. Priests and deacons are invited to vest. All are welcome. For more information, call the parish at 716-627-2910. Catholics are encouraged to participate in a solemn observance of the Roe v Wade anniversary by placing a candle in the front window of their homes at sundown on the evening of January 22. The candle serves as a reminder of 50 million unborn babies who have been aborted since the 1973 Supreme Court decision.
