SLOW ROLL IS PLANNING TO RIDE THROUGH THE NEIGHBORHOOD!

On Monday, October 2, Slow Roll Buffalo--the popular weekly bike ride--is planning to be in your neighborhood. We will be riding just a block from the church. Please be advised that some streets might be closed to traffic between 6:00 p.m. and 8 p.m. for 15-20 minutes while approximately 1,000 bicyclists roll through. Orange and black signs can be seen on some of the streets along the route.

If you would like to join in on the fun on October 2, the ride begins promptly at 6:00 p.m. at the Broadway Market (note the earlier start time for October). We will return to where we started by about 8 p.m., and all riders are welcome to stay for an after party.

The ride is free and as the name says we ride slowly so everyone can keep up. There is a different meeting place and route every Monday night from May through October. All ages are invited, including children, but no training wheels are allowed. Riders should expect an approximately 10 mile ride, with a couple stops along the way. We have more than 100 volunteer "Squad" members in orange shirts to ensure a safe ride for everyone.

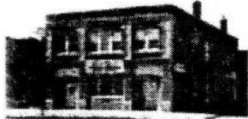
